23/24 AT A GLANCE

We hosted over 250 events, including Shabbat dinners, holiday celebrations, social gatherings, and educational programs, bringing together hundreds of Jewish students and community members.

JEWISH LEARNING FELLOWSHIP

Students who participate in the eight-week cohortbased Jewish Learning Fellowship at Cleveland Hillel and Oberlin Hillel embark on a transformative journey of discovery, exploration, and growth. Designed for students seeking to deepen their understanding of Jewish tradition and identity, JLF offers a dynamic blend of study, discussion, and experiential learning.

Led by knowledgeable mentors and featuring an engaging curriculum, JLF provides a supportive environment for students to delve into topics ranging



from Jewish history and philosophy to contemporary issues and personal reflection.

ISRAEL ENGAGEMENT

Israel Engagement lies at the heart of Cleveland Hillel's mission, offering a dynamic array of programs and initiatives that foster deep connections to the land, culture, and people of Israel. Through immersive experiences, educational opportunities, and meaningful dialogue, we strive to create a vibrant and inclusive community where every student can explore their relationship with Israel in a supportive and open-minded environment.

Jewish Agency Israel Fellow Program

Lielle Ziv was Cleveland Hillel's Israel Fellow from 2022-2024. In her time at Hillel, Lielle worked tirelessly to support students on and off campus, and was been instrumental in connecting with and supporting students in the aftermath of October 7th, leading multiple projects and events.

In the fall of 2023, Lielle taught Kol Yisrael, a 6-week cohort learning program for students to explore big ideas and big questions with Israel as a real-world case study. After the war began, she shifted focus to the events since October 7th, giving space for discussion and questions. Lielle has also created multiple displays on campus to both honor the hostages and encourage productive dialogue among students.

Lielle brought students to hear former Israeli Prime Minister Naftali Bennett speak, and spearheaded a discussion with Bassem Eid, a pro-Israel Palestinian human rights activist and political analyst who gave students an in-depth look about the origin of Hamas and the struggles of the Palestinian people. Other initiatives include bringing "Roots", an Israeli-Palestinian grassroots initiative for understanding, nonviolence and transformation, to CWRU to speak with students.

From taking students to the Cleveland Cavaliers vs Maccabi Ra'anana basketball game to setting up a Jewish Day of Unity (כ״ט בנובמבר), Lielle always brought an important perspective to her her work, making her an invaluable member of the Cleveland Hillel team.







Israel Advocacy Workshops

Our workshops and classes like our six-week-long Kol Yisrael learning cohort empower students to become informed advocates for Israel on campus and beyond using real-world case studies. Through interactive discussions, skill-building exercises, and guest speakers, participants learn how to effectively communicate Israel's story, address misinformation, and engage in constructive dialogue about the complex issues facing the region.

Cultural Celebrations and Festivals


Throughout the year, Cleveland Hillel hosts a variety of cultural celebrations and festivals that highlight the beauty and diversity of Israeli culture. Our annual Israel Week features traditional Israeli cuisine and cultural events that offer students the opportunity to celebrate and connect with Israel's vibrant heritage.

Speakers & Seminars

Our speaker series and seminars bring leading experts, scholars, and thought leaders to campus to discuss a wide range of topics related to Israel, including politics, history, religion, and innovation. These engaging events provide students with the opportunity to deepen their understanding of Israel's complexities and engage in nuanced conversations about its past, present, and future. Previous speakers have included Palestinian human rights activist Bassem Eid, survivors of the October 7th massacre, Rabbi Hanan Schlesinger and Noor A'wad from Roots, an Israeli-Palestinian grassroots initiative for understanding and nonviolence, and Israeli actor and IDF veteran Yadin Gellman.







OBERLIN

Since the 1950s, Oberlin College and Conservatory has offered its Jewish students the opportunity to create a Jewish community on campus. It did so initially by offering a small number of programs staffed by a part-time professional.

Beginning in the 1970s the Cleveland Hillel has provided full-time staff and a small but comprehensive slate of programs and services.

Oberlin College has always had a unique Jewish community, with many students coming from both a politically and religiously liberal background. The history and numbers of Jewish students attending the college (estimated between 20-25% of the student population) has resulted in a naturally vibrant and dynamic Jewish



activity. We strive to sponsor cutting-edge programming on campus, especially on issues of gender and social justice. Arts and culture have also played a significant role in program development at Oberlin College Hillel, and an appreciation for deeply engaging Jewish educational content remains strong with our student population.

Hillel staff at Oberlin help cultivate Jewish student leadership and life by facilitating daily and weekly gatherings of Jewish students, drop-in get-togethers in the Hillel lounge space, weekly meetings of Jewish interest groups, and many large social and educational programs. Many gatherings on campus this year have been created around developing opportunities for focused micro-communities / cohorts to develop and build community.

- Weekly Shabbat and holiday celebrations
- Hillel's Jewish Learning Fellowship (JLF). This year's topics have focused on the following curricula: Life's Big Questions and Pursuing Justice
